


**FIRST INFORMATION REPORT AGAINST MR KHABA PAONAM,**  
**GENERAL SECRETARY, MPP**

Sir,

1. Please refer to the statement made by Khaba Paonam, General Secretary, MPP published in article "**Act defiling modesty of two women**" in the Sangai Express newspaper on 20 Jul 2023 (Copy att) alleging "Assam Rifles and Central Security Forces personnel have been accused of killing innocent Manipur civilians and sexually assaulting and killing women and that these crimes have not been appropriately punished."
2. The aforesaid statement against the Assam Rifles is unverified, malicious and is clearly aimed at spreading disaffection. The vested statement is made to malign the image of Assam Rifles, is purposefully promoting hatred against the Assam Rifles which has been deployed across the state to safe guard the general population during the current times. The said statements amount to inciting hatred, disaffection and violence against the Assam Rifles, an agency of the Government.

Further, during the present times when the Government Agencies are involved in maintaining law & order situation and peace in the state, there is a need to take urgent action against Mr Khaba Paonam, General Secretary, MPP for making such defamatory statement, for inciting hatred against a Government Agency, provoking violence amongst masses and instigating people.

## One rescued, four detained and handed over to family

IMPHAL, Jul 20: Imphal East Yaingangpokpi Police have successfully rescued a man from an area in the vicinity of Mahadeva Ching under Litan PS around 11 am today.

The individual in question has been identified as one Moirangthem Naoba alias Sonamani (25), s/o Moirangthem Lemba Meitei from Moirang Thamuapokpi.

According to reports, Army personnel informed Yaingangpokpi Police that a man was wandering around in the area. The police team picked up the man and handed him over to his family.

Separately, Yaingangpokpi Police detained four individuals

during a normal checking routine.

The four have been identified as Laishram Girani Singh (58), s/o (L) Ibotombi Singh of Nongren Mayai Loikai; Chingakham Ibaicha (50), s/o (L) Ch Rajamhi Meitei of Nongpok Kakching; Lourenbam Tomba Meitei (60), s/o (L) L Gandrasing of Lamlai Mayai Leikai and Awungpam Awungshi (41), s/o (L) Mahangai Awungshi of Shingkap village, Kamjong district.

The four were allegedly brought to Shingkap village in Kamjong district by one Awungpam Awungshi in connection with some work opportunities.

Yaingangpokpi Police have handed over the four to their respective families.

## MPP, EEVFAM, CFJM condemn act defiling modesty of two women

In response to the shocking viral video of two women being paraded nude by a mob on May 4, many have expressed strong condemnation of the despicable act.

The Manipur People's Party (MPP) in a statement issued by Khaba Paonam, general secretary, Media, MPP has demanded the concerned authority to dole out strict punishments to the culprits as per the law. When in battlefield or war-like situations, many atrocities like killings, kidnappings and so on are inevitably carried out. However, it is a gross human rights violation to torture and

abuse captives, MPP said.

Referring to Prime Minister Narendra Modi finally breaking his silence on the Manipur issue with the emergence of this viral video, the MPP has stated that the Prime Minister remained mum when numerous other atrocities occurred in Manipur during the course of this conflict. It questioned if the Prime Minister had been waiting for a suitable opportunity to speak out and put all blame on one community.

Alleging that there are many cases wherein Assam Rifles and Central Security Forces personnel have been accused of killing innocent Manipuri civilians and sexu-

ally assaulting and killing women, MPP said that the culprits of these crimes have not yet been appropriately punished.

Condemning the act, the Extrajudicial Execution Victim Families Association Manipur (EEVFAM) and Citizens For Justice Manipur (CFJM) have demanded stringent punishment for the culprits befitting the nature of crime against humanity, women in particular, as per the law, in their respective statements.

Further, EEVFAM maintained that the Government must take responsibility for all the atrocities meted out to innocent civilians.

## Aid extended to accident victims

KAMJONG, Jul 20

Assam Rifles under the aegis of HAK (South) extended life saving medical assistance to road accident victims of H Godah village of Kamjong district yesterday.

Two young men aged 20 years and 15 years met with a road accident between H Godah and Lening village on July 19. The injured were rushed by the villagers to the Assam Rifles Medical Hospital at Shangshak and were immediately provided life saving medical care to stabilize their condition, said a statement by the Assam Rifles.

Later both the victims were evacuated to RMS hospital via unit ambulance after the initial stabilisation without delay.

Crisis solution: 50 per cent legal, 50 per cent political

## Crisis solution: Fifty percent legal, Fifty percent political

The crisis in Manipur has crossed 75 days and with no signs of the violence simmering down, the lapses in the floundering government is becoming more prominent. People from all sections of the Manipuri society have started to question if the two pillars of the Indian democratic principle, namely, the legislature and the executives had failed in their roles to restore peace and normalcy in the state.

At this crucial juncture, the hope of every Manipur citizen now rests in

the hands of the judiciary and media to ensure that no one is deprived of their fundamental rights and that swift justice is administered.

"The Indian legal system alone cannot usher full solution to the Manipur crisis; I believe 50 per cent of the solution will be brought through the court systems and 50 per cent through political means," said Yumnam Premnanda, head of department, Department of Law, Manipur University.

Speaking to this Imphal Free Press reporter in an exclusive interview, Premnanda stated that the issue in Manipur was not

a legal issue alone but a multi-dimensional problem with heavy doses of political issues.

He maintained that both central and state governments would have to analyse the history and unique features of Manipur if they were to draw out a political solution.

The unique feature of Manipur

Premnanda asserted that the state of Manipur was different from the rest of the states in India and noted that Manipur was the only state in India to sign both the Instrument of Accession and the Merger Agreement in 1947 and

1949 respectively.

Even states like Kashmir merged to the Indian Union only with Instrument of Accession, but the annexation of Manipur to the union was done on two agreements. So, certain special features arose in the agreement," he said.

He pointed out that the merger agreement of 1949 was a bilateral treaty between independent India and independent Manipur and as such, the territorial integrity of states which merged with the Indian Union through the merger agreement could not be dismantled.
