Sir,

As endorsed to me, I would like to submit the findings of the enquiry report in c/w the missing report- Missing No.1/Ltk-PS/2024 Dtd 04/03/2024 Vide GD entry no. 21/LTK-PS/2024 Dtd04/03/2024 @ 7:10 PM.

That, on 04/03/2024 at around 7:10 PM, a missing report was filed by Okram Thoiba Singh(35) S/O Okram Khomei Singh of Santipur, Ningthoukhong ward no.2 in c/w missing of his father namely Okram Khomei Singh (62) S/O (L) O Ibobi Singh of Santipur, Ningthoukhong ward no. 2. As per the report, his father went out in the morning at around 8:0 AM of 04/03/2024 on his bike (Bajaj CT100 B) black in colour without any registration number and never came back.

As the missing report was endorsed to me for investigation, I started the initial investigation by recording the statement of the complainant. On the day of his missing i.e. 04/03/2024, at around 8 AM, the complainant (son) found his father at a nearby road of Santipur with his bike. The complainant was returning after dropping his children to the school. He found his father removing the plug of his bike so he asked him if there is no petrol and told his father that he will send his younger brother to help him. As the complainant reached home, he told his younger brother (Johnson) that their father is at the nearby road with his bike and he should go to help him. So, Johnson went to meet his father. Few minutes later, Johnson came back alone, when the complainant ask his brother(Johnson) about their father, Johnson told him that he has given petrol to his father and must be coming in some time. So, there was no suspicion and hence the complainant continued his daily work.

As it was getting late in the evening and since they saw their father only in the morning, they started to get worried and tried reaching their father many times through his phone # 7005698613 but the phone was switch off. Hence, the complainant decided to file a missing complaint to the police station. Thus, the missing complaint was filed on the same day at around 7.10 PM and endorsed to me for investigation.

After receiving the missing report, CDR and SDR of the missing person's phone number was requested through Superintendant of Police BPR with Memo no. 447/LTK-PS/2024 Dtd 04/03/2024 and CCTV footage of surrounding areas including from Loktak PS as well as different private individuals and other government offices were monitored to identify which route the missing person might have gone. While watching the CCTV footage from SBI Loktak-Hepa Branch at NHPC office, it is learnt that the missing person was proceeding towards Leimatak road on his bike. Immediately, many locals in the surrounding areas were informed about the missing person heading towards Leimatak road and to report back if he is found. Throughout the night, information was collected from different local sources trying to identify if anyone has seen him.

The next day, a message was also sent out to all OC's/ PSS in Manipur to trace the missing person. The same day at around 9:30 AM (Ref. GD entry no 18/LTK-PS/2024 Dtd 05/03/2024 @ 9:30 AM) a large number of combined team of Police, CDO-BPR, CRPF and 2 Maha Regiment along with OC Loktak PS visited Lamdan to make a look out of the missing person. The team also met with C-32 CRPF posted at Lamdan to gather any information about the missing person. But there was no sign of the missing person and hence they came back without finding anything.

On the same day, many Police personnel mainly from the nearby areas who are well aware of the terrain/routes were sent out to trace the missing person but could not find any sign of the missing person's whereabouts.

In the light of the above facts and circumstances, as the last seen footage of the missing person was of him proceeding towards Leimatak road on his bike and there is no further information, it is highly suspected that he might have ventured in Kuki dominated areas towards Leimatak. By taking advantage of the current communal clash, it is suspected that the missing person might have been already abducted by Unknown Kuki miscreants from Leimatak road on the same day (04/03/2024). Hence, it is requested that a regular FIR be registered for further the road investigation.
