

PRESS NOTE
Imphal, the 8th July 2026

- I. The overall law-and-order situation in the state during the last 24 hours was normal.
- II. Security forces continue to conduct search operations and area domination in the fringe and vulnerable areas across districts.
- III. Intelligence based combing, cordon and search operations are being carried out extensively to nab those involved in extortion and criminal activities in the state:
 1. On 08.07.2026, Manipur Police arrested an extortionist active cadre of KYKL, one Takhellambam Gremichand alias Inaocha Singh (52) of Singjamei Mayengbam Leikai, Imphal West district from Kalika Bamon Kampu area under Irilbung-PS, Imphal East district along with a 9 mm pistol, two magazines, and seventy live rounds.
 2. On 07.07.2026, security forces arrested an extortionist active cadre of KCP (PWG), one Angom Chingkheinganba Meitei (27) of Umathel Makha Leikai, Kakching district from Aihang Village Gate under Waikhong-PS, Kakching district.
- IV. During a raid on 07.07.2026, a joint team of Manipur Police and NCB recovered approximately 22 kgs of WY tablets/Methamphetamine packed in 19 packets from the house of one Ms. Paominlin Munlo of Churachandpur. A Mahindra Bolero (MN-01AS-6029) was also seized from the house compound.
- V. Movement of **151** vehicles carrying essential items along NH-37 has been ensured. Strict security measures are taken up in all vulnerable locations and security convoy is provided in sensitive stretches to ensure free and safe movement of the vehicles.
- VI. A total of **114** Nakas/Check points were installed in different districts of Manipur, both in the hills and the valley.
- VII. Appeal is made to public not to believe in rumour and be vigilant of false videos. The veracity of any circulation of unfounded videos, audio clips etc. may be confirmed from the number- 9233522822 of Central Control Room. Moreover, there are possibilities of many fake posts being circulated on social media. It is hereby cautioned that uploading and circulation of such fake posts on social media will attract legal action with consequences. Further, appeal is made to public to return the looted arms, ammunition and explosives to the police or nearest security forces immediately.
