

PRESS NOTE
Imphal, the 19th July 2026

- I. The overall law-and-order situation in the state during the last 24 hours was normal.
- II. Security forces continue to conduct search operations and area domination in the fringe and vulnerable areas across districts resulting in recovery of arms and ammunition:
 1. On 19.07.2026, security forces recovered from the foothill of Maiba Khul under Heingang-PS, Imphal East district, a cache of arms and ammunition including the following:
 - i) 03 (three) 12 bore single barrel guns,
 - ii) 01 (one) SMG carbine with magazine,
 - iii) 01 (one) 9mm pistol with magazine,
 - iv) 02 (two) .32 pistols with magazines,
 - v) 03 (three) Lethod shells,
 - vi) 01 (one) Chinese hand grenade,
 - vii) 02 (two) BP plates,
 - viii) 02 (two) helmets and
 - ix) 01 (one) BAOFENG wireless set.
- III. Intelligence based combing, cordon and search operations are being carried out extensively to nab those involved in extortion and criminal activities in the state:
 1. On 18.07.2026, security forces arrested an active cadre of SOREPA, one Loitongbam Priyokumar alias Imuthoi Meitei (48) of Khongyam Makha Leikai, Wangoo-PS, Kakching district from his residence.
 2. On 18.07.2026, security forces arrested an active cadre of KYKL, one Nemboy Singh (27) of Thoubal from general area of Gamphazol village near IMB under Molcham-PS, Chandel district.
An AK-47 rifle, two Molotovs, and five rounds of .22 ammunition were seized from the arrestee.
- IV. On 18.07.2026, security forces destroyed an illegal distilleries of DIC liquor at Monglham, MT Geltam and M. Gamngai under Sangaikot-PS, Churachandpur district.
Three local made 12 Bore (SBL) guns were recovered.
The following were destroyed:
 - i) 1550 litres of DIC Liquor,
 - ii) 146 pots, substantial quantity of yeast cake, yeast powder, and
 - iii) 120 fermented rice bags.
- V. Senapati District Police successfully conducted a week-long Cyber Awareness Programme from 13th to 18th July, 2026 across various schools and colleges in the district in observance of Manipur Police Cyber Awareness Week.

As part of the initiative, all the police stations under Senapati District Police actively reached out to educational institutions to create awareness on emerging cyber threats and safe online practices.

The week-long programme culminated on 18th July, 2026 with a special Cyber Awareness Programme organised at the Conference Hall of the Superintendent of Police, Senapati, in collaboration with NIELIT Senapati.

Shri D. Elia, Guest Faculty, NIELIT Senapati, conducted an informative session on malicious cyber attacks, phishing, cyber security best practices and provided hands-on training on securing mobile phones and protecting personal digital information.

VI. As part of Community Policing Programme, a one-day Mega Free Health Camp was organised at 7 MR, Khabeisoi today. The camp was conducted by the unit Medical Officers with the assistance of medical specialists.

Free medical services in General Medicine, General Surgery, Orthopaedic, Obstetrics & Gynaecologies, blood sugar testing and medicines were provided to 269 beneficiaries including civilians from the locality of Khabeisoi.

VII. Manipur Police continue its drive to curb motor vehicle offences:

1. From 13.07.2026 to 19.07.2026, Manipur Police issued **197 (one hundred ninety seven)** challans to motor vehicle offenders, amounting a total of **Rs. 2,13,000/- (two lakh thirteen thousand) only**.
2. From 13.07.2026 to 18.07.2026, tinted films from **163 (one hundred sixty three)** vehicles were removed.

VIII. A total of **113** Nakas/Check points were installed in different districts of Manipur, both in the hills and the valley, and **04** persons were detained.

IX. Appeal is made to public not to believe in rumour and be vigilant of false videos. The veracity of any circulation of unfounded videos, audio clips etc. may be confirmed from the number- **9233522822** of Central Control Room. Moreover, there are possibilities of many fake posts being circulated on social media. It is hereby cautioned that uploading and circulation of such fake posts on social media will attract legal action with consequences. Further, appeal is made to public to return the looted arms, ammunition and explosives to the police or nearest security forces immediately.
