Imphal, the 24th July, 2026

- I. The overall law-and-order situation in the state during the last 24 hours was normal.
- II. The DGP Manipur, Shri Mukesh Singh, IPS, accompanied by ADGP (L&O) Manipur, visited Tengnoupal District today to review security preparedness, policing and inter-agency coordination at Tengnoupal District Police Office, the DGP reviewed the overall security situation and policing arrangements in the district. Interacting with officers of the district police, he stressed the importance of sustained operations against anti-national elements, effective investigation of cases, intensified anti-drug measures, recovery of illegal arms and ammunition, and close coordination with all security agencies to ensure peace and security in the border district. During his visit to Moreh Town, the DGP interacted with representatives of various communities including Tamil, Kuki, Nepali, Meitei Pangal and CSOs of the border town.

The DGP also held interaction sessions with the Commandants of 36 Assam Rifles and 3 Assam Rifles, along with officers of the Assam Rifles and Manipur Police Commandos. During the meeting, he reviewed the prevailing security scenario, operational preparedness, border management and inter-agency coordination, while emphasising the importance of continued synergy among all security forces. The DGP further visited Gate No. 1 and Gate No. 2 at Moreh to review the security arrangements and deployment at the international border crossing. On his return journey, he visited Kwatha Village, where he interacted with Meitei villagers, officers and personnel of the District Police, Central Armed Police Forces (CAPFs) and Assam Rifles deployed in the area.

The visit reaffirmed the commitment of the Manipur Police and all security agencies towards strengthening border security, enhancing inter-agency coordination and ensuring lasting peace and public safety.

- III. Security forces continue to conduct search operations and area domination in the fringe and vulnerable areas across districts resulting in recovery of arms and ammunition:
 1. On 24.07.2026, security forces recovered from the Sangaithel Park area, Patsoi-PS, Imphal West district, the following:
 - i. 08 (eight) pistols with magazines,
 - ii. 04 (four) rifles,
 - iii. 03 (three) hand grenades,
 - iv. 03 (three) detonators,
 - v. Assortment of live rounds and empty cases,
 - vi. Magazines,
 - vii. Military fatigue including BP jackets, magazine pouches, wireless communication sets etc.

- IV. Intelligence based combing, cordon and search operations are being carried out extensively to nab those involved in extortion and criminal activities in the state:
1. On 23.07.2026, Manipur Police arrested an extortionist active cadre of KYKL, one Mayanglambam Tomba Singh alias Lakpa (39) of Churachandpur Bijang Khunou, a/p Phubala Relief Camp from Tera Urak Checkpoint under Bishnupur-PS, Bishnupur district.
The following were seized from him:
 - i) 01 (one) 9mm pistol along with magazine, and
 - ii) 11 (eleven) live rounds ammunition of different calibers.The arrestee is involved in causing explosion at a petrol pump earlier at Moirang.
- V. Movement of **195** vehicles carrying essential items along NH-37 has been ensured. Strict security measures are taken up in all vulnerable locations and security convoy is provided in sensitive stretches to ensure free and safe movement of the vehicles.
- VI. A total of **113** Nakas/Check points were installed in different districts of Manipur, both in the hills and the valley.
- VII. Appeal is made to public not to believe in rumour and be vigilant of false videos. The veracity of any circulation of unfounded videos, audio clips etc. may be confirmed from the number- **9233522822** of Central Control Room. Moreover, there are possibilities of many fake posts being circulated on social media. It is hereby cautioned that uploading and circulation of such fake posts on social media will attract legal action with consequences. Further, appeal is made to public to return the looted arms, ammunition and explosives to the police or nearest security forces immediately.
