13. First Information contents:

The brief fact of the case is that on 29/06/2026 at 8:20 am received reliable information that on 28/06/2026 at about 1400 hrs humanitarian relief materials including ration meant for the affected public along IT Road were being transported in approximately 20-30 vehicles under the escort of security personnel comprising of Reserve Team of Kangpokpi District Police and CRPF (QAT-112/94 Bn) to ensure safe and uninterrupted passage.

When the convoy reached Thonglang Atongba, it was forcibly stopped and wrongfully restrained by a large unlawful assembly numbering about 300 comprising women and youths, allegedly instigated and led by the leaders of SDSA (Senapati District Student Association), ANSAM (All Naga Student Association Manipur), NHACM(Naga Humanitarian Aids Committee) and the Village Authority, Thonglang Atongba by blocking the road with wooden ballies, burning tyres, Mashals and boulders. The members of the unlawful assembly intentionally blocked the movement of the convoy and prevented the delivery of humanitarian relief materials to the intended beneficiaries by insulting those using abusive languages.

To solve the issue, re-enforcement teams comprising of B/194 RAF (Rapid Action Force) and District Police teams led by senior District Police Officers rushed to the spot. Repeated attempts were made by senior officers of the escorting security forces to peacefully negotiate with the leaders and persuade them to disperse by 2100 hrs. However, all such efforts were turned down, and the mob continued to obstruct the convoy starting from 1400 hrs.

Consequently, after exhausting peaceful means, the security forces were compelled to use minimum force by firing tear gas shells and firing blank rounds in the air to disperse the unlawful assembly at 1200 hrs (midnight). Instead of dispersing, the mob turned violent by pelting stones, Sling shots with Marbles and metal projectiles at the security personnel and the convoy and vandalizing several security vehicles including the civilian vehicles transporting the relief materials, causing damage of varying degrees. As per report received, the windshield of SDPO/KPI's Gypsy utilized by RI/OC-Chalwa were broken, few scratches on SDPO/KPI's vehicle, the front door (left side) and hood of OC/KPI Gypsy were torn, the Windshield of duty Magistrate was broken, the windshield and front bumper of Ecco Van B/R.No. MN 03C 0395 were damaged and others, yet to be confirmed.

On the other hand, Kangpokpi Police team (KPI-PS) resorted to fire 13 (thirteen) Tear Gas Shells and 21 (twenty-one) 9 mm live rounds ammunition; Kangpokpi Police Reserve Line had fired 21 (twenty-one) rounds of AK ammunition & 18 (eighteen) rounds of INSAS ammunition and also, RAF fired 21 (twenty-one) TSM Stun Pawa, 03 (three) TSM Stun Normal, 02 (two) TSM L/R Chilli, 02 (two) TSM S/R Chilli, 34 (Thirty-four) TSM L/R Soft Nose, 04 (Four) TSM Stun Soft Nose S/R of Non-Electric Shell and 19 (Nineteen) TSM L/R of Electric Shell. Moreover, Loss of Arms/Ammunition includes 02(two) Nos of Empty case of Electric Shell and 01(one) No of empty case of Non-Electric Shell. There is no report of casualties received during the incident.

After hectic efforts, the convoy cleared the road at around 0130 hrs on 29/6/2026 and all the stranded persons/vehicles transporting relief materials towards Chalwa and Kangpokpi has been safely escorted towards their respective destination by the convoy.

Hence, a case under FIR No. 18(6)2026 KPI-PS U/S 126(2)/221/351(3)/324(2)/189(1)/61(2) & 3(5) BNS has been registered for investigation.

When the convoy reached Thonglang Atongba, it was forcibly stopped and wrongfully restrained by a large unlawful assembly numbering about 300 comprising women and youths, allegedly instigated and led by the leaders of SDSA (Senapati District Student Association), ANSAM (All Naga Student Association Manipur), NHACM (Naga Humanitarian Aids Committee) and the chairman/Chief of Village Authority, Thonglang Atongba by blocking the road with wooden ballies, burning tyres, Mashals and boulders. The members of the unlawful assembly intentionally blocked the movement of the convoy and prevented the delivery of humanitarian relief materials to the intended beneficiaries by insulting them using abusive languages.

To solve the issue, self along with re-enforcement teams comprising of B/194 RAF (Rapid Action Force) and District Police teams led by senior District Police Officers rushed to the spot. Repeated attempts were made by senior officers of the escorting security forces to peacefully negotiate with the leaders and persuade them to disperse by 2100 hrs. However, all such efforts were turned down, and the mob continued to obstruct the convoy starting from 1400 hrs.
