

PRESS NOTE
Imphal, the 31st July, 2026

- I. The overall law-and-order situation in the state during the last 24 hours was normal.
- II. Security forces continue to conduct search operations and area domination in the fringe and vulnerable areas across districts.
- III. Intelligence based combing, cordon and search operations are being carried out extensively to nab those involved in extortion and criminal activities in the state:
 1. On 31.07.2026, Manipur Police arrested an active cadre of KCP (PWG), one Khunthoklemba Oinam (30) alias Lemba of Singjamei Oinam Thingel, Imphal West district from his locality.
He is involved in placing a hand grenade at a Yumnam Leikai, Singjamei residence earlier on 28/07/2026.
 2. On 30.07.2026, security forces arrested 02 (two) active cadres of PREPAK from the general area of Border Pillar no. 80-81 under Moreh-PS, Tengnoupal district:
 - i. Takhelbam Yaiphaba (25) and
 - ii. Khumukcham Tondonba (22).
- IV. Upon receipt of information from Khuzama Police Station, Nagaland on 31.07.2026 regarding a stolen Maruti Jimny car (AR-01T-5409), Manipur Police intercepted the vehicle at Senapati Police Drop Gate.

The car and the driver have been handed over to the Khuzama Police team, Nagaland for further legal action.
- V. Movement of **300** vehicles carrying essential items along NH-37 has been ensured. Strict security measures are taken up in all vulnerable locations and security convoy is provided in sensitive stretches to ensure free and safe movement of the vehicles.
- VI. A total of **111** Nakas/Check points were installed in different districts of Manipur, both in the hills and the valley.
- VII. Appeal is made to public not to believe in rumour and be vigilant of false videos. The veracity of any circulation of unfounded videos, audio clips etc. may be confirmed from the number- **9233522822** of Central Control Room. Moreover, there are possibilities of many fake posts being circulated on social media. It is hereby cautioned that uploading and circulation of such fake posts on social media will attract legal action with consequences. Further, appeal is made to public to return the looted arms, ammunition and explosives to the police or nearest security forces immediately.
