4	Brief of the work done	1) On 01/08/2026 at 12.15 am, ASI Samson Singh Laishram, i/c-SMPU, Jiribam lodged a written report with OC-JBM-PS stating that on 31/07/2026 at around 11.30 a.m. an information was received from his own source regarding transportation of some illegal contraband drugs in a Ford EcoSport vehicle bearing Regn. No. As 01DJ-6360 from Imphal to Cachar, Assam side along nh-37. Accordingly, acting on the information Qat Dett. 48 bn. CRPF started frisking and checking under the supervision of Shri, Prakhar Pandey (IPS) SP- Jiribam at Leingangpokpi village, Jiribam along NH-37. At around 10.00 p.m., the above noted Ford EcoSport vehicle bearing Regn. No. As 01DJ-6360 arrived at the said spot driven by one unknown person later identified as Bhima Panika (DoB- 02/05/1984) S/o Mohon Panika of Panika Basti, posilonijan, ps- santipur, Dist.- Karbi Anglong, Assam. On checking the said vehicle 10 (ten) packets wrapped with plastic transparent were found hidden inside the rocker panel of the said vehicle suspected to be brown sugar weighing 5.21 kgs. Hence the case.

2) On 07/08/2026 at 10.55 pm, ASI. Kh. Inaoba of CDO/IE attached with CDO/Unit, Jiribam lodged a written report with OC/JBM-PS at around 5.00 pm under the overall supervision of Shri Prakhar Pandey, IPS, Superintendent of Police, Jiribam, along with teams of CDO-Unit, Jiribam assisted by one team of Jiribam – PS, 7th IRB, Uchathol, Jiribam, QAT/Dett. 20th Bn. CRPF, QRT 156th Bn. CRPF, QAT/Dett. 48th Bn. CRPF, 87th Bn. CRPF and 38th Assam Rifle, launched a special operation based on credible intelligence indicating that certain anti-social elements were loitering in and around the Jiribam Bazar area and were involved in collecting extortion money from transport operators and local businessmen in the name of an underground (UG) organization and also disruption of any supplies or services essential to the life of the community in Jiribam District and in the state of Manipur, thus threatening its economic security.

During the course of the operation, one suspected individual was detained at Jiribam Bazar, in front of the Cruiser Counter. Upon verification, he identified himself as Akoijam Shankar Singha (47) yrs @ Chepta @ Yumshangba S/o (L) A. Kamini Singha of Gossaipur Part-I, Cachar District, Assam. During verification, the detainee disclosed that he is an active cadre of the proscribed underground organisation UNLF (P). He stated that he had joined the organisation in 1997 through one Chinglen as a cadre of 12th Batch. He further revealed that he underwent three months of basic military training at the Council Camp, Myanmar, under an instructor known as Koireng, along with 46 other cadres. He stated that his Army No. is 556. He further disclosed that he had earlier been arrested during 1999/2000 from the Wangkhei area. He further stated that during the ethnic unrest in Manipur, he rejoined the organisation through one SS Captain Apabi and is presently holding the rank of Sergeant. According to him, he is presently attached to the Organisation Department under the command of Lt. Col. Nongthrei @ Bungobi, a resident of Dibong Karong near the Forest Office.

The detainee further disclosed that he had been collecting extortion money from the Cruiser vehicle counters at the rate ranging from Rs. 300/- per vehicle to Lumpsum amount of Rs. 10,000/-. Besides he has been collecting money from other small businessmen in and around Jiribam Bazar in the name of UNLF (P).

He further stated that the extorted amount collected every day is handed over to their commander Lt. Col. Nongthrei @ Bungobi.

Based on the above facts and circumstances, the above-mentioned detainee was arrested at about 10.45 pm of the same day and seized 02 (two) mobile handset (1) VIVO T3x 5G and (2) VIVO Y12G and one UNLF identity card in his name at 10.55 pm of the same day. Hence the case.

3) On 20/08/2026, ASI. W. Rominchandra Singh of BBK-PS lodged a written report with OC/BBK-PS stating that on 20/08/2026, receipt of credible and reliable information regarding the presence and movement of certain anti-social elements in and around Tupidhor Villages along the Barak River, Jiribam District, a special operation was launched based on the information received. Accordingly, a police team led by ASI. W. Rominchandra Singh of BBK-PS, under the command of Inspt. Md. Rajib Khan, OC/Borobekra PS, launched the operation under the guidance of Shri. Th. Kamaljit Singh, MPS, Addl. SP (L&O), Jiribam, and Shri. Noorkamal Sheikh, MPS, SDPO/Jiribam, and under the overall supervision of Prakhar Pandey, IPS, SP/Jiribam. The police team, in coordination with a team of 38 Assam Rifles led by JC. 3800197L Sub. Sukleswar Ray and 20 Bn. CRPF, proceeded to the said area and conducted area domination and patrolling in and around Tupidhor Villages along the Barak River with a view to verifying the information, identifying the suspected anti-social elements, and preventing any unlawful activities.

During the course of the operation, the combined team intercepted and detained six persons at Tupidhor Village along the Barak River who were travelling on a local boat and were found carrying a bag suspected to contain illegal contraband. The detained persons, along with the suspected bag, were brought to Borobekra Police Station for further verification and necessary legal proceedings.

During preliminary examination, the detainees disclosed that the carry bag contained suspected WY Tablets and Heroin No. 4 Powder. Accordingly, the carry bag was checked in the presence of the detainees and Shri. Noorkamal Sheikh, MPS, SDPO/Jiribam, who was present as a Gazetted Officer. On checking the carry bag, the following suspected contraband substances were found: (i) Suspected WY Tablets: 08 compressed packets wrapped in black-colour plastic, weighing approximately 9 Kg and 412 grms (including plastic covers). (ii) Suspected Heroin No. 4 Powder: 04 soap cases containing compressed material wrapped in black-colour plastic, weighing approximately 177 grams (including plastic containers/covers).

During examination, the detainees stated that the suspected drugs were intended for sale to prospective buyers and further disclosed that the approximate value of the recovered suspected contraband in the international illicit market was ₹30 Crore. The detainees further disclosed that the suspected drugs had been brought and were being transported for sale by the following persons: (i) Elbethel Lungtau (30) Yrs. S/o. Ramhlusang Lungtau of JorKhal, Chekavcham FV, Cachar, Assam (ii) Pana Hmar (42) Yrs. S/o. (L) Rama Hmar of B. Hunveng, Bhutangkhel, Jiribam Dist. Manipur. (iii) Denthar Hmar (42) Yrs. S/o. (L) Jir Haojang Hmar of Jorkhal, Chekavcham FV, Cachar, Assam. (iv) Laltlunglien Hmar (30) Yrs. S/o. Rohelun Hmar of Sakulthai, Mizoram, Aizawl Dist. (sailor) (v) Lal Ramthar Hmar (32) Yrs. S/o.

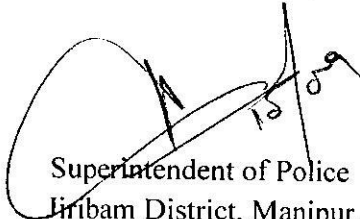

In view of the recovery of the suspected contraband and the statements/disclosures made during examination, the concerned persons were arrested at about 01:45 pm at Borobekra Police Station in accordance with law. The following suspected contraband and mobile phones were seized at about 02:15 pm at Borobekra Police Station after due examination and in the presence of witnesses, following the prescribed legal procedure: **(A) Suspected Contraband** (i) Suspected WY Tablets: 08 compressed packets wrapped in black-colour plastic, weighing approximately 9 Kg and 412 grms (including plastic covers). (ii) Suspected Heroin No. 4 Powder: 04 soap cases containing compressed material wrapped in black-colour plastic, weighing approximately 178 grams (including plastic covers). **(B) Mobile Phones** (i) Mobile Phone – Vivo Y11 5 G Smartphone (white or gold finish colour) with Airtel SIM Card Mobile No.6900850702, No. seized from Borobekra Police Station. (ii) Mobile Phone – Redmi A5 Smart Phone model No. 25028RN031 (light blue colour) with JIO SIM Card Mobile No.9863887496, seized from Borobekra Police Station. (iii) Mobile Phone – Realme P4X 5G Smart Phone model No. RMX5100 (Silver Colour) with Airtel SIM Card Mobile No.7099589254, seized from Borobekra Police Station. (iv) Mobile Phone Xiaomi Redmi 12 5G Smartphone model No. 23076RN4B1 (Jade Black colour) with Airtel SIM Card Mobile No.8134812648, seized from Borobekra Police Station. (v) Mobile Phone – POCO C50 Smartphone (Blue Colour) with Airtel SIM Card Mobile No.8099111894, seized from Borobekra Police Station. (vi) Mobile Phone – Realme Note 70 Smartphone (model No. RMX5313 (Black colour) without SIM Card, seized from Borobekra Police Station.

The arrest and seizure proceedings were conducted at Borobekra Police Station after due examination of the detained persons and the recovered articles, in the presence of witnesses.

In view of the above facts and circumstances, I therefore request you to kindly lodge an FIR under the appropriate provisions of the NDPS Act and other relevant laws against the arrested persons and take up further necessary legal investigation into the matter, including identification of the source, intended recipients/buyers, transportation route and other persons connected with the illegal trafficking of the suspected contraband. Hence a case.

		4) On 24/08/2026 at 04.40 p.m. HC. Kh. Angousana Singh, SMPU, Jiribam lodged a written report with O.C. Jiribam P.S. stating that on the same day at around 02.30 p.m., the complainant and his team conducted routine frisking and checking at NAKA Check Point, Leingangpokpi village, Jiribam along NH-37. While doing so, one Tata Truck bearing registration No. AS 01 EC-7699 driven by unknown driver was coming from Imphal side towards Cachar, Assam side along NH-37 and signal to stop the vehicle. However, the driver did not pay any attention to stop and proceeded towards Jiribam side. In no time, the police team chased the vehicle. The vehicle was stopped about 200 mtrs. away and fled away the driver of the vehicle towards hill slop. The matter was informed to the senior officers. In no time, Shri Prakhar Pandey (IPS) SP, Jiribam, Shri. M. Ojit Singh, Executive Magistrate, Jiribam, team of JBM-PS, QAT/Dett-48 Bn. CRPF and QAT/Dett-20 Bn. CRPF also arrived at the spot. Thereafter, the search of the truck bearing registration No. AS 01EC-7699 was carried out. On checking the roof of driver's cabin of the said vehicle, 03 (three) packets brown colour wrapped with transparent polythene were found kept on the roof of driver's cabin. On opening the said 03 (three) packets, it was found containing 50 (fifty) nos. of sachets each of suspected WY tablets and were removed from the truck in front of the Executive Magistrate, Jiribam. On opening one of the sachets, it was found containing 200 (two hundred) nos. of WY tablets (altogether $03 \times 50 \times 200 = 30,000$ tablets, approximately). The said tablets were then weighed on a weighing scale. On weighing it was found 3. 646 kgs. The Tata truck bearing registration No. AS 01EC-7699 was also seized. Hence the case.
